	<p>EXERCISE DESIGN COMMITTEE: [JEFF ASHWORTH, CHAIR] Joe Marcotte reported on behalf of Jeff. The next exercise will be a full-scale exercise hosted by Billings Clinic on October 1st.</p> <p>The next meeting of the Exercise Design Committee is September 24 at 10:00 in Billings Clinic Cancer Center 4th Floor Conference Room. Meetings are the 4th Tuesday of each month in the same location.</p>																
	<p>BILLINGS CLINIC: EVACUATION EXERCISE – OCTOBER 1. The event is a simulated full hospital evacuation using mock patients. Approximately 12 mock patients will be transported to an alternate care facility (Saint Vincent Healthcare) by AMR. The scenario is caused by a simulated loss of power to the Billings Clinic main campus, including the hospital. Community partners involved at this point include: All Billings Clinic operations; RiverStone Health; Saint Vincent Healthcare; AMR; Billings Police Department; Billings Fire Department; Yellowstone County DES; MT DPHHS (HavBED system); MT Healthcare Association (Mutual System). There are also several agencies who will be observing the exercise. The live portion of the exercise will begin at 13:00 and end at 15:30. A hot wash is scheduled for October 2 at 15:00 in Billings Clinic Basement Conference Center Rooms 1&2. For questions, contact Joe Marcotte at Billings Clinic.</p>																
	<p>2013 ROCKY MOUNTAIN SHAKEOUT Joe also mentioned the 2013 Rocky Mountain Shakeout, a drill targeting most of the states connected to the Rocky Mountains. Montana is making a concerted effort to get strong participation in this drill. The drill will happen on 10/23/13 at 10:23 AM. 	<p>POINT OF DISPENSING EXERCISE: Greg Neil reported that this exercise should take place sometime the week of April 7, 2014. The date is possibly negotiable. The plan is for CDC to deliver the "Eagle Pack" (a simulation tool for the SNS) which contains objects that are similar to those in the SNS push packs. It was suggested that consideration be given to not plan anything too close to the COYOTE 2014 exercise in May.</p>																

<p>COMMITTEE REPORTS (CONT.)</p>	<p>COYOTE 2014: The Coyote 2014 Exercise will be an off-site / co-exercise with the Billings Airport. The Billings Airport is required to do an exercise every two years to comply with FAA mandates. Planning of COYOTE 2014 Exercise is underway. Volunteers and volunteer victims are always needed. Contact Jeff Ashworth for more information or attend and exercise design team meeting. The 1st table top has been completed. The next scheduled tabletop drill will be sometime in May 2014. However, there may be other tabletop or functional drills between now and next May.</p>	
	<p>GRANTS COMMITTEE [DIANNE LEHM, CHAIR] Dianne reported that work on the BLM-Fuels Reduction / fuels mitigation grants are still in progress. The Fuels reduction grant has another year to complete.</p> <p>Reps. from the State of Montana visited Billings yesterday (9/11) and suggested that Yellowstone County should make more applications using the HMGP program. There is an opportunity for additional mitigation funding for Alkali Creek under pre0disaster mitigation and/or the HMGP program. Applications are due by late spring 2014.</p> <p>Billings Clinic and Saint Vincent Healthcare have applied for and should soon receive grant funding through the Hospital Preparedness Program (Health and Human Services)</p>	
	<p>CAER/CITIZENS CORPS [PAM SANDERSON, CHAIR] – No report</p> <p>No report. Pam was not present due to the United Way Day of Caring activities.</p>	
	<p>HEALTH & MEDICAL ADVISORY GROUP (HMAG) [DEB HEDRICK, CHAIR]</p> <p>Greg Neil spoke on behalf of Debbie Hedrick. He introduced Claire Oakley who has replaced Hillary Hanson. Greg reported that there have been four confirmed West Nile virus cases in the county. Late summer through early fall tend to see the highest prevalence of WNV.</p> <p>Work is continuing on the "exploration" of a rabies incident earlier this summer which required enactment of a rabies quarantine for the county. RiverStone Health is working with Animal Control to explore the exact meaning of a rabies quarantine (and how to enforce). A suggestion was made that, following the finalization of details, some public education might be appropriate about the meaning of a rabies quarantine. Greg will take that idea back to the group working on the matter.</p> <p>RiverStone is also strengthening its relationship with the local American Red Cross affiliate. It was reported that there will be a new full-time Red Cross employee stationed in Billings.</p> <p>The next HMAG meeting is September 27 at 10:00 at the RiverStone Health offices.</p>	
	<p>CONFERENCE SUB-COMMITTEE [GREG ROADIFER / AARON STULC, CO-CHAIRS] Joe reported on behalf of the Committee chairs. A copy of the draft conference schedule has been completed. Work continues on getting the final product done as soon as possible. Speakers are still being contacted and secured. <p>OLD BUSINESS</p>	<p><u>STATUS OF BY LAWS SUB-COMMITTEE RE-WRITE – PAM SANDERSON & DUANE WINSLOW</u> Joe report that the small work team has not met since the last LEPC meeting. There has not been any further feedback from the County Attorney. The team will be reviewing information summarized by Pam from the LEPC Handbook which may or may not alter some of the work in progress. 	<p><u>ELECTION OF OFFICERS – PENDING</u></p>	
<p>OTHER BUSINESS</p>		
<p>AGENCY ROUNDTABLE:</p>		
	<p><u>BILLINGS FIRE DEPARTMENT:</u> three new firefighters; the USPS BDS exercise went very smooth; the exercise provided great training value. Thank you to Rae Ann Haight and the USPS for the opportunity and a job well done.</p> <p><u>LAUREL POLICE (RICK MUSSON, CHIEF):</u> the recent issues pertaining to Judge Baugh pointed out the need to address high-profile public officials (or other private sector individuals) and the potential for significant interruption of "normal" operations.</p> <p><u>FBI (BRYAN VAN DEUN):</u> FBI is moving to new office space in October. The FBI facilitated training recently for 28 attendees regarding improvised explosives, including live explosives demonstrations at the airport.</p> <p><u>YARES (CHUCK BIKLE):</u> YARES provided communications support for the Cycle Greater Yellowstone event in late August. They will be providing support for the Yellowstone Alpine Climb on September 7, the Tour de Cure on September 14, and the Montana Marathon on September 15.</p> <p><u>CITY OF BILLINGS PUBLIC WORKS (GARY WORKMAN):</u> Storm response to the September 7 severe storm has proven significant. Many storm drains were plugged due to debris and hail.</p> <p><u>NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE (TOM FRIEDERS):</u> Billings and the region received a record amount of moisture from the September 7 storm. The storm "blew up" just west of Billings bringing with it 70 mph winds, hail to ¾ inch in diameter, and up to two inches of rain in some areas. The NWS has not issued a flash flood warning in September dating back to 1986. Tom is interested in receiving pictures of any damage from the storm. There is a potential for heavy rain again this weekend, probably not as intense. The outcome of the storm is probably an opportunity for some individual, organization, and community education about flash flooding.</p>	

	<p>ALTERNATIVES, INC. (JUDY SCHNEIDER): Judy reported that this will be her last LEPC meeting. She is retiring effective 10/1. She is not sure who the replacement on the LEPC will be. Alternatives, Inc. underwent a state audit the week of 9/1 and the results were very positive. She has photos from the USPS BDS exercise and will forward them to Rae Ann.</p> <p>RIVERSTONE (GREG NEIL): reported that the Greater Billings Psychological Consultation Team that functions under the umbrella of the HMAG has been meeting regularly and working on the development of emotional first aid / crisis intervention protocols. The group typically meets at RiverStone on the second Friday of the month at 07:00.</p> <p>EXXONMOBIL (KELLY DRAIN): A 3-week turnaround is currently in progress. They have completed enhancements to the refinery alarm / alerting system. The system alerts internal to the plant as well as neighboring areas. Some community education, including fliers was distributed. Participated in the pipeline tabletop drill on 8/25.</p> <p>Kelly also shared a lesson learned about cell phones and 911 contacts. When a call is made to 911 using a cell phone, the cell phone is locked to the 911 system and cannot be used to make other calls for about 30 minutes. One can power down the phone and reboot to get out of the lockout.</p> <p>FAITH CHAPEL (CHRISTIE BRAGG): CERT training is in progress today. Faith Chapel has created a group called the "Red Shirts" who are designated responders in times of crisis. There are currently 58 responders identified.</p> <p>RIMROCK FOUNDATION (JIM ECKENROAD): 16 facilities under the Rimrock Foundation umbrella. The Rimrock Foundation will be undergoing Comprehensive Accredited Rehabilitation Facility (CARF) accreditation survey in 2014.</p> <p>BILLINGS CLINIC (JOE MARCOTTE): Billings Clinic experienced a fair amount of storm damage (primarily flooding) from the September 7 storm. The flooding was the result of a fair amount of hail that froze over storm drains. Joe will be teaching ICS-200, ICS-300, and ICS-400 classes this fall. See the Training section for a list of dates. Billings Clinic continues to have a significant amount of construction activity in progress on its main campus.</p>
