	<p><u>March 29: Solar Storm Exercise, YARES - Faith Chapel</u> Ron Glass, YARES facilitated a Formidable Footprint exercise at Faith Chapel, 517 Shiloh Road, Rm #510, on Saturday, March 29th. Yares members as well as members of the two newly-formed CERT Teams in Billings attended.</p>																			
	<p>Chuck Bikle and Chuck Bushy both reported that they were disappointed in the scenario due in part to the lack of detailed information regarding the actual impacts such an event would have on communities beyond the failure of the electrical grid itself. They also said there was little or no information about how to prepare for the impact a solar storm or what steps could/should be taken to mitigate the damages.</p>																			
	<div data-bbox="253 1255 808 1633" data-label="Figure"> </div> <p>Space weather events can damage equipment over wide geographic regions so that recovery delays become substantially longer and more costly.</p>																			
	<p>As North America has evolved into a unified power-sharing network of regions, each buying and selling a diminishing asset, US domestic power has become more vulnerable to solar storms buffeting the power grid in the more fragile northern-tier states and Canada.</p> <p>In spite of the best efforts, failures still can occur; for example, a lightning strike can still cause on occasion a high voltage transmission line to trip. Very high winds, for example, due to a tornado can cause the failure of a line or several lines on a common corridor.</p> <p>Space Weather differs from ordinary weather in that it has a big footprint and attacks the system across</p>																			

	<p>many points simultaneously, causing at times of severe events multi-point failures on the network that can threaten the integrity of the network.</p> <p>Therefore, geomagnetic storms may be one of the most important hazards and is certainly the least understood threat that could be posed to the reliable operation of these networks... And there is no part of the U.S. power grid that is immune to this. It is just a matter of where does this intense phenomenon geographically lay down? How big is the footprint? And we know these footprints can be very, very large. And literally, we could impact a population of over 100 million in the worst case scenarios."</p> <p>One implication of the research is that identification of strategic points in the grid system can enhance defense against interruptions, whether by equipment failure, natural disasters or human activity. Major blackouts caused by failures in the grid incur tremendous economic, public-health and security risks.</p>

	<p>HEALTH & MEDICAL ADVISORY GROUP (HMAG) [GREG NEILL] Greg Neill reported that at the last HMAG meeting discussion regarding health care facilities and concealed weapons permits. The current regulations do not list health care facilities as one of the places where it is not permissible to carry a concealed weapon. To read the requirements regarding concealed weapons please see the Montana Department of Justice website. www.doj.mt.gov</p> <p>Greg also reported that they are working with the Montana Livestock Association to draft a plan to address future rabies quarantines and answer questions for the community regarding what does a county-wide quarantine mean and what to do.</p> <p><i>March 19, 2014: Steve Merritt Public Information Officer, Montana Department of Livestock, reports that the <u>State's First Rabies Case Serves As Good Vaccination Reminder</u></i></p> <p><i>The state's first rabies quarantine of 2014, issued last week for Big Horn County, should serve as a good reminder for pet owners to review vaccination records for their dogs, cats and ferrets. "It's that time of year," said assistant state veterinarian Dr. Tahnee Szymanski. "If your pet hasn't been vaccinated recently, or if you aren't sure, contact your veterinarian and get it taken care of now."</i></p> <p><i>Based on statistics from the past three years, rabies generally makes an appearance in early spring, then the number of reported cases increases until a peak in late summer. "We see rabies year-round, but it's much more common in the summer when the potential for pet/wildlife interactions is highest,"</i></p> <p><i>Szymanski said. "The number of reported cases peaks in July, August and September, when we have four to five times as many cases as we do at any other time of year (see attached chart of rabies cases by month)."</i></p> <p><i>If you're going to be outside enjoying the great Montana outdoors with your pets, or if your pets spend any time outdoors – even in a fenced yard – it's prudent to vaccinate. Vaccination is inexpensive and effective, and could save you from having to make tough decisions regarding your pet, as non-vaccinated animals or those past due for vaccination must either be euthanized or placed under a strict six-month quarantine if exposed to a known or suspected rabid animal.</i></p> <p>See more at: http://liv.mt.gov/news/2014/2014-0319_rabiesreminder.mcp#sthash.PdFA2MQ2.dpuf</p>

AGENCY EDUCATION SESSION: COUNTY WATER DISTRICT - BILLINGS HEIGHTS		
	<p>Established in 1958 as the Bench Association for Water. It was incorporated in 1963 and is known today as the County Water District of Billings Heights.</p> <p>As such, they serve approximately 13,000 people, have an annual revenue of 1.2 to 2.5 million per year, repair and maintain more than 125 miles of water lines, 688 fire hydrants, pumping stations all with a crew of 5.</p> <p>Water usage for the district is approximately 1 million gallons per day in the winter and 4.5-5 million gallons a day in the summer.</p> <p>The have access to backhoes, dump trucks and have the capabilities to do water shuts offs in the event of an emergency.</p> <p>Future goal is to develop a website where their customers can access information and pay their water bills online.</p>
