CLOVERBUDS – (Amy Ward, Kathy Holler, Roni Baker and Stephanie Johnson) Cloverbuds will do many fun, hands on activities during the day.

BEADED WIRE BOOKMARK – Beginner - (Sue Roberts) Using wire, a needle nosed pliers and a selection of beads, you will be able to create a unique bookmark with twisted ends. These are great to be given as a gift or keep for yourself.

PAINTED SUITCASE – Intermediate - (Bernie Mason) Make your suitcase your own and easy to identify when traveling by painting your own creation on the outside. Bring a suitcase and an idea of what you would like to create, and we will decorate the outside to make it easy for you to identify on the airport luggage carousel. You can bring a design you would like to paint on the suitcase – some will also be available.

CLAYMATION – Beginner – (Lisa Terry) Claymation is the generalized term for *clay animation*, a form of stop animation using clay. Participants will sculpt characters from clay and then take a series of still digital pictures that are then used to make a video. Some of the more famous claymation characters in history include Gumby, Pokey, and Wallace and Gromit. Bring a digital camera if you have one. Class size is limited to ten.

LEATHERCRAFT – Beginner – (Steve Lackman) Learn beginning basics of leathercraft stamping. You will be making wrist bands and magic billfolds.

BRAIDING – Beginner – (Travis Standley) Learn basic braiding techniques such as the round braid to make fun items in this class.

BRAIDING – Intermediate – (Travis Standley) Participants will learn how to flat braid. This technique is used to make many braided items. You can make halters with leads, hobbles, or saddle handles.

LET'S FACE IT ... IT'S TIME! Altered Clocks – Intermediate - (Melody Harris) Come join in this fun scrapbooking technique workshop, as we alter clocks to fit your personality, or make one as a gift! Participants are asked to bring photos that they wish to use.

BEGINNING CLAY CRITTERS – Beginner – (Emma Phipps) - In this fun, hands on class you will learn the basics of making character/farm animals w/polyform clay.

PICTURE WALL HANGING – Intermediate - (Nancy Byxbe) – Members will make a bulletin board using a picture frame, batting, fabric and ribbon.

WOODWORKING – Beginner –(Leonard Zier) – In this class you will make a woodworking project to take home.

THE DYE - Beginner- (Matthew McClellan) The look of tie dye is back! Create a fun, colorful t-shirt and matching set of socks in this easy, hands on workshop. You must bring a pre-washed white cotton t-shirt and a pair of white socks for this class.

ROCKETRY - Beginner/intermediate – (Matthew McClellan) Design and build a rocket that actually flies out of a 2 liter soda bottle (actual launch is weather dependent). You need to bring a clean 2 liter soda bottle with the label removed for this class.

COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT - FLEECE HATS – (All instructors) For our Community Service Project this time, we will have fun stitching up easy-to-make Polar Fleece hats that will be given to Service Organizations for distribution to children in need.

SEWING WORKSHOPS LISTED BELOW – If you have a sewing machine, be sure it comes cleaned, oiled and with a NEW needle. Be sure you have the cords and foot control for your machine, those are so easy to forget! Practice using your sewing machine before you come. All participants must bring **scissors that will cut fabric, straight pins, measuring tape, 1 spool neutral thread (light), 1 spool dark thread (blue or black), wound bobbins**. Be sure to mark your supplies.

T-SHIRT TOTE BAG – Intermediate - (Bernie Mason) Take a favorite T-Shirt, do some cutting and sewing and before you know it you have a Tote Bag. This is a great way to have another use for those special T-Shirts you no longer wear. Be sure to bring a T-Shirt you want to use for the bag.

PAJAMA BOTTOM PANTS – Beginner – (Sue Roberts) Be snug-as-a-bug-in-a-rug when you wear the polar fleece P J Pants you will sew in this class, Once you learn how to make these simple to make pants, you will want to sew more. Please indicate on the registration form what size pant you wear and if it a child or teen size.

TABLE TOPPER – Intermediate – (Phyllis Hansen and Laurie Lautt) Come join in the fun as we make a spring time centerpiece for the table. This 6 sided topper is a quick and fun quilting project. You start with a focus fabric, add two borders, stitch the back, flip right side out, press and topstitch. Rotary cutters will be used!

QUILTING – Intermediate (Lacey Lanaghan and Kailee Lance) Make a crazy table runner during this fun, in-depth 2 ½ hour class.
