## Lockwood Pedestrian Safety District Advisory Board

June 3, 2020, 7pm

- In attendance: Nic Talmark, Woody Woods, Elyse Monat, Brandy Dangerfield, Carlotta Hecker  
Absent: Chuck Strum, Pam Ask, Tobin Novasio, Zachary Hassler
- Public Comment: None
- Minutes from the May meeting were approved as corrected.
- Updates sent by Chuck Strum for the Advisory Board to consider in his absence:
  - There has been no resolution to the Titan Machinery lot issue of water running off their property and flooding the sidewalk we built. Chuck reported no response from the Titan's Corporate office attempting to address this issue. Chuck was asked to provide contact names and phone numbers so other members of the board can try to get this issue moved forward before the rainy season comes and pedestrians are unable to use the sidewalk and possible damage to the sidewalk from all the setting water.
  - Chuck reported the County has no new news on the easement issues on Piccolo Lane so a survey can't be done to even determine costs. Woody reported he is going to meet with Tim at the County and see what progress if any has been made. As an Advisory Committee if there is no progress we might want to turn our attention to sidewalks along Old Harden Road going East of First Interstate Bank and addressing the need in his area to get people off the road onto a sidewalk.
  - Chuck indicated BCS has agreed to keep the price of the Memorial signage the same, so the Advisory Committee asked Chuck to proceed and get it ordered. There will be a group meeting on June 5th on the new sidewalk to determine where the best placement of the sign will be. Anyone interested can attend. Nic reported he had met with the Freese family and they are in favor of the sign and agreed to be part of the celebration and the presentation. We need to get the sign ordered before the end of this month as that is the end of our fiscal year for using the PILT funds.
  - Since we do have money left over in the PILT funds it was decided to have Chuck order 3 more new trail counters before the end of June and submit the invoice asap so it gets paid from present PILT funds. One will be used on Piccolo, one for future expansion on Old Hardin Rd, and one as a backup.
  - Chuck reported Interstate Engineering has submitted a proposal to Yellowstone County to conduct a traffic study for the Becraft/Westgate intersection, the proposal has not yet been accepted and this is a County expense not a LPSD expense. This issue was there long before the sidewalk project.
  - Nic indicated that since crowds of up to 50 can gather we might start to look at a ribbon cutting ceremony with the Freese family present and media present.
- PILT fund for this next year LSPD decided to ask for \$2,000.00 since we have been asking and getting \$3,000.00 over the past couple of years. We can use what is left of our \$3,000.00 this fiscal year to buy 30 helmets for our Safe Routes to school celebration along with 150 slap bands to be given away this fall when we hold the bike giveaway.
- Woody informed the Advisory Board that the fiscal budget meeting for next year meets on June 23, 2020, 2pm. Brandy indicated she would attend along with Woody to go over our budget for the next fiscal year. It may be at this meeting that Brandy tells the Commissioners that with no progress on Piccolo that Old Hardin Road will be considered for the next project.
