RESOLUTION RELATING TO RURAL SPECIAL
IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 717; CREATING THE
DISTRICT FOR THE PURPOSE OF UNDERTAKING
CERTAIN LOCAL IMPROVEMENTS AND FINANCING THE
COSTS THEREOF AND INCIDENTAL THERETO THROUGH
THE ISSUANCE OF RURAL SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT
DISTRICT BONDS SECURED BY THE COUNTY'S RURAL
SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT REVOLVING FUND
AND CREATING RURAL SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT
MAINTENANCE DISTRICT NO. 717M FOR THE PURPOSE
OF MAINTAINING THE IMPROVEMENTS

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Yellowstone County (the "County"), Montana, as follows:

Section 1. Passage of Resolution of Intention. This Board, on March 30, 2004, adopted Resolution No. 04-20 (the "Resolution of Intention"), pursuant to which this Board declared its intention to create a rural special improvement district, designated as Rural Special Improvement District No. 717 of the County (the "District"), under Montana Code Annotated, Title 7, Chapter 12, Part 21, as amended (the "Act"), for the purpose of financing a portion of the costs of certain improvements described therein (the "Improvements") and paying costs incidental thereto, including costs associated with the sale and the security of rural special improvement district bonds drawn on the District (the "Bonds"), the creation and administration of the District, the funding of a deposit to the County's Rural Special Improvement District Revolving Fund (the "Revolving Fund") and the establishment of a reserve account securing the Bonds in the District fund (the "Reserve Account"). This Board also declared its intention to create and establish in the County under the Act, a rural special improvement maintenance district designated Rural Special Improvement District No. 717M (the "Maintenance District") for the purpose of maintaining the Improvements.

Section 2. Notice and Public Hearing. Notice of passage of the Resolution of Intention was duly published and mailed in all respects in accordance with law, and on May 4, 2004, this Board conducted a public hearing on the creation or extension of the District and the making of the Improvements. At the hearing, this Board heard and passed on all protests made during the period ended 30 days (or in this case, 31 days, as the 30th day fell on a Sunday) after the first date of publication of the notice of passage of the Resolution of Intention (the "Protest Period"). A motion was duly passed by the Board to consider the resolution creating the District at the next scheduled Board meeting on May 11, 2004. Property owners in the proposed District were permitted to attend and explain their protests if any. Two protests were heard at the May 11 meeting, one of which was heard and passed on by the Board. The Board determined the other protester lived outside the District's proposed borders and thus could not be counted as a protest against the formation of the District. The Board again considered the creation of the District at its May 18, 2004 meeting, and duly deferred adoption of this Resolution until May 25, 2004, the date of the next regularly scheduled meeting of this Board.


Section 3. Protests. Within the Protest Period, four protests representing six lots, tracts, or parcels were filed with the County Clerk and not withdrawn by the owners of property in the District subject to assessment for 3.658% of the total costs of the Improvements and incidental costs to be financed with proceeds of the Bonds. The Board notes that following the Protest Period one additional protest was received, representing two lots, tracts, or parcels, and even if this untimely protest was deemed to be valid, the total protests against creation of the District would represent 4.878% of the total costs of the Improvements and incidental costs to be financed with proceeds of the Bonds.

Section 4. Creation of the Districts; Insufficiency of Protests. The District is hereby created on the terms and conditions set forth in, and otherwise in accordance with, the Resolution of Intention. The protests against the creation or extension of the District or the making of the Improvements filed during the Protest Period are hereby found to be insufficient. The findings and determinations made in the Resolution of Intention are hereby ratified and confirmed, including, without limitation, the findings and determinations relating to the Revolving Fund and Reserve Account.

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
